

## FIRST READING

EZEKIEL 34:11–16, 20–24

<sup>11</sup>For thus says the Lord GOD: I myself will search for my sheep, and will seek them out. <sup>12</sup>As shepherds seek out their flocks when they are among their scattered sheep, so I will seek out my sheep. 
**SECOND READING**





COMMUNION SONG




COMMUNION HYMN
