- \* Overseeing assistant Coordinators who handle responsibilities such as scheduling, meals, supplies, activities, donations
- \* Coordinating volunteers and scheduling with support congregation Coordinators
- \* Acting as primary contact for any emergencies
- \* Communicating policy, procedures and other information to volunteers, ensuring guest confidentiality and addressing any issues concerning congregation volunteers

Being a Coordinator is a big job, but it is important to remember that St. Michael congregation will be hosting only 4 weeks out of the year. Most Coordinators work full time and have children and other commitments so the demands are quite manageable. You will also have the support of assistant coordinators, well-trained volunteers and the network director. In the best case scenario, St. Michael would have co-coordinators who share the tasks of directing efforts.

Coordinators may serve for a couple of years; in some networks they have served for 15 years or more. The reward of seeing families go from despair to independence and volunteers engage in the most meaningful outreach of their lives makes it all worthwhile.
